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Dr. Chad W. Autry is the William J. Taylor Professor of Supply Chain Management in the College of Business Administration at the University of Tennessee. Dr. Autry's professional background includes several years experience in retail and restaurant operations management. He has worked with and for numerous professional, civic, and governmental organizations related to supply chain process improvement, including American Airlines, Boise Corporation, Con-Agra, IBM, Hallmark, Pearson Publishing, Goodwill Industries, the American Red Cross, and multiple branches of the U.S. Department of Defense including the Marine Corps, Air Force, and Army Materiel Command. He has served on the SCPro Certification Development Committee and Education Strategies Committee of the Council of Supply Chain Management Professionals (CSCMP), the national Board of Directors of the Warehouse Education and Research Council (WERC), and has taken active roles at local and national levels for the Production and Operations Management Society (POMS), Institute for Supply Management (ISM), and National Association of Purchasing Managers (NAPM).

Dr. Autry's research focuses primarily on socially responsible and collaborative Interfirm and interfunctional relationships, their integration within and across firms, and the technological and social issues that support connectivity across multiple organizations simultaneously. He is author of over 50 articles in academic and professional outlets including the Journal of Business Logistics, Journal of Operations Management, Journal of Retailing, Journal of Management, International Journal of Logistics Management, and Strategic Management Journal. He is a co-author of the recent book, Global Macrotrends and Their Impact on Supply Chain Management, published by Financial Times Press.

Dr. Autry is currently an Editor in Chief of the Journal of Supply Chain Management and serves as an Associate Editor of the Journal of Business Logistics, Decision Sciences Journal, and Logistique' Management, in addition to serving on the review boards of several other academic and managerial publications.

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
